## Liturgy Corner

### Initiation Sacraments

Most Catholics know that there are seven sacraments in the western Roman church. But did you know that the three initiation sacraments are **Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist** (in that order too)? On Easter week-end we welcomed three young children into the church; they were baptized, confirmed and received Communion for the first time at Easter Sunday Mass. Of the three sacraments, only Eucharist is a repeatable sacrament. It's a very long story of how Confirmation came to be celebrated after First Communion, but nevertheless, for children of seven years and older (not baptized as infants) and adults, the celebration of all three sacraments is meant to happen at one liturgy.
