Today's Gospel (Mark 1:21-28)

Power & Authority

Today's Gospel passage says Jesus taught in the synagogue and His teaching made deep impression on the people because His teaching differed from that of the scribes. In what does the teaching of Jesus differ from that of the scribes? It is in the fact that Jesus taught with authority. He spoke with the finality of the voice of God. With His divine authority and power Jesus casts out demons. This is a sign that the Kingdom of God has broken into the world, overcoming the power of evil. It is a sign of the victory of light over darkness.

When Jesus teaches, he shares not only His wisdom but His power. Jesus' actions are His principal teachings. That is His unique authority. He uses His power to liberate people from the evil forces that dominate their lives.

The important point is that Jesus stays committed to using His power for good. He continues to exercise His authority to liberate those who are bound up and to confront those who lay burdens on the weak. Applause or no applause; no matter what the opinion polls say, Jesus carries on with His mission.

#### **WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS 2018**

The Church will mark the 55th World Day of Prayer for Vocations on the Fourth Sunday of Easter, 22 April 2018. The Holy Father has released a Message entitled "Listening, discerning and living", which is available on the Vatican website. Pope Francis refers to three aspects of a vocation: "In the diversity and the uniqueness of each and every vocation, personal and ecclesial, there is a need to listen, discern and live this Word that calls to us from on high and, while enabling us to develop our talents, makes us instruments of salvation in the world and guides us to full happiness." The Message is also linked with the upcoming Synod of Bishops that will take place on October 2018 on the theme Young People, The Faith and Vocational Discernment.
